To encourage our youth to attend more live performance shows, we offer \$30 tickets to people who are 30 years old or younger.

\$25 Child tickets

New this year we are adding a child's ticket price. For ages 18 and under.

Discounted Early Bird tickets

Two months before a show starts, shows can opt to go on sale with an early bird ticket price of \$50 per adult, \$40 per SuperGold Card and \$30 for concession tickets. The sale is announced via Circa email and social media. Patrons have two weeks to take up the discounted offer before normal pricing resumes. Signing up to the Circa e-newsletter or following us on Facebook or Instagram will ensure you see when the early birds are on.

\$40 Sunday Special*

On the first Sunday performance of a show season, select shows can offer a special \$40 sale price per seat.

Choose Your Price Night*

Shows offer a price scheme whereby tickets can be purchased at differing price points ranging from \$15 to \$65 per person. Tickets can be bought at any price in this range, depending on how much the seat holder cares to pay. The purpose of this scheme is to find ways to allow everyone to get to enjoy the theatre.

\$40 Show Preview

The first performances of a show season, before opening night, are called a Preview. Shows can choose to hold these as part of their rehearsal process, some may hold more than one and some may not choose to have one at all. The price of a preview performance is \$40 per seat, and patrons will get to see the play first and also save. The preview can be an important milestone in a play's development.

ACCESSIBILITY AT CIRCA

Circa Theatre strives to make theatre of the highest quality available to all members of our community.

At Circa Theatre some shows enlist qualified New Zealand Sign Language interpreters to interpret what is being said in the live performances for Deaf or hard of hearing audience members who use New Zealand Sign Language to communicate. The interpreter is usually on the side of the stage, or part of the action on the stage.

Performances can also include an audio described show which is the method of describing the non-verbal action in a play into headsets worn by blind and visually impaired audience members, so that they can access non visual components. We also provide a touch tour before hand allows people to explore the set and costumes, and props if available.

Circa Theatre also facilitates a Relaxed Performances for people who benefit from a more relaxed theatre environment where we welcome movement, taking a break, and noise throughout. Neuro divergent, autistic and disabled are especially welcome.
